

Guidelines

Joe E. Gaddy, Jr. graduated from Reynolds High School in 1963. He completed his undergraduate degree at Davidson College and his medical degree at UNC-Chapel Hill. He has been a practicing cardiologist in Winston-Salem for over 20 years.

In honoring the late Margaret McDermott, his Latin teacher at Reynolds High School, and other educators like her who helped instill his ideals and values, Dr. Gaddy has established a scholarship for the professional staff of Reynolds High School to be known as The Gaddy Educator Scholarship. As you know, Dr. Gaddy has already established a scholarship fund for an annual award to a graduating Reynolds senior known as The Gaddy Student Scholarship.

Purpose:

It is the intent of the Gaddy Educator Scholarship to provide scholarships for the professional staff at Reynolds High School. Educators must have **at least 3 years work experience at Reynolds** and be in pursuit of any one of the following areas:

- continuing education such as workshops and college courses for teaching-certificate renewal
- professional conferences
- educational travel to be incorporated into the classroom and/or school curriculum
- Masters degree work
- classroom/teaching supplies such as books, learning programs, computers; software, tapes; videos, etc.

The Gaddy Educator Scholarship is administered by the Winston-Salem Foundation. Applications for the educator award can be requested from The Winston-Salem Foundation at 714-3445 or by email at Edna.Barker@wsfoundation.org or kdillon@wsfoundation.org beginning immediately. **The application receipt deadline is March 31.** The recipient will be selected shortly after this time by the Student Aid Committee of the Winston-Salem Foundation.

The amount of the award will be \$1,000 annually. The number of recipients could vary from year to year and there may be restrictions on same-recipient successive awards. The Winston-Salem Foundation reserves the right to withhold the award in the event there are no acceptable applicants in any given year.

Checks will be issued as the recipient's schedule requires and will be mailed to the recipient. Please allow two weeks check processing time.

The scholarship monies must be applied by the end of the calendar year in the year in which they are awarded or be forfeited.
