

Edwin E. and Grace Kimrey Maddrey Scholarship Guidelines

DEADLINE: March 31

SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTION:

This scholarship was established in 1997 to provide college scholarships to graduating high school seniors who are members of First Presbyterian Church in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and who have chosen to attend either Guilford College, Davidson College, or UNC-Chapel Hill as full-time undergraduate students. The amount of the scholarship is \$2,500 each year for four consecutive years of undergraduate study for a total amount of \$10,000.

CRITERIA:

To be considered, applicants must:

- attend Guilford College, Davidson College, or UNC-Chapel Hill
- demonstrate academic promise by achieving a current cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.5
- demonstrate citizenship, character, and community involvement
- be a graduating high school senior
- be a member of First Presbyterian Church in Winston-Salem

APPLICATION PROCESS:

The following items are required to complete the application process:

- submittal of completed application and signed signature page (deadline 3/31)
- official high school grade transcript through at least 1st semester of the 12th grade (deadline 3/31)
- one recommendation from a teacher, guidance counselor, coach, principal, employer, clergy, or other community leader who has supervised, counseled or coached applicant in some capacity (deadline 3/31)

SELECTION PROCESS:

Once applications and all requested materials have been received, the selection committee will review applications and select a recipient during the latter part of April. In order for applications to receive consideration, the application and requested supplemental materials must be received by the deadline.

RENEWAL PROCESS

Recipients receiving renewal awards must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 and full time enrollment at accredited four- year institutions. Official grade transcripts must be submitted each summer by ***July 1*** for verification of acceptable academic pace and GPA. Recipients should request grade transcripts from the Registrar for themselves and forward to the Foundation so they will know the transcript has been sent.

Upon verification of continued eligibility, a check for fall semester will be jointly issued to the student and the college and will be mailed to the student for presentation to the college Financial Aid Office. Spring semester checks are usually issued in November each year.

PAYMENT PROCESS

Once a recipient has been selected a scholarship check will be issued jointly to the college and the recipient and mailed to the recipient's home address for delivery to the college's financial aid office. Separate checks are issued for fall and spring semesters. Check processing requires approximately two weeks.

MANAGEMENT OF THE FUNDS:

This scholarship fund is administered by The Winston-Salem Foundation. Anyone can contribute to the fund at any time. Gifts should be clearly designated for this scholarship and mailed directly to the Foundation.
