Foundation Announces January Community Grants

The Winston-Salem Foundation announces **15 Community Grants totaling \$491,029** that will touch the lives of many living in Forsyth County. The grants were awarded to arts, human services, health, educational, and public interest organizations.

The grants are the following:

- **Community Care Center for Forsyth County** - \$45,000 to support a diabetic case manager/educator
- **Crosby Scholars Community Partnership** - \$100,000 to support the capital campaign
- **ECHO Network** - \$138,500 to foster enriching, trusting, and long-lasting relationships among diverse people
- **Family Services** - \$35,000 to help support the grant services manager position for a second year
- **Festival Stage of Winston-Salem** - \$15,000 to support a marketing research study
- **Historic Bethabara Park** - \$7,500 to improve educational resources in the Visitors Center
- **Promise Neighborhood Community Collaborative** - \$30,000 for a program coordinator
- **Shepherd's Center of Greater Winston-Salem** - \$20,000 to support a part-time senior center program assistant
- **Trinity Center** - \$15,000 to help support additional costs to the organization for the executive director position
- **Wake Forest Health Sciences** - \$15,353 to support a licensed psychologist associate for the outpatient therapy program
- **Winston-Salem Delta Fine Arts** - \$14,000 to support Web site upgrades and fund development work
- **Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools** - \$14,731 to help support a bilingual community outreach worker for teen mothers and their children for a fourth year

- **Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools** - \$8,445 to determine how to improve progress for special education students by using Android tablet technology
- **Winston-Salem Youth Chorus** - \$15,000 to hire a strategic planning consultant
- **YMCA of Northwest NC** - \$17,500 to support an after-school running program for middle school students

The Winston-Salem Foundation is a community foundation that supports charitable programs in the greater Forsyth County area. Founded in 1919 by Colonel Francis Fries with a \$1,000 gift, it now administers over 1,300 funds, and had total custodial assets of over \$276 million at the end of 2011. In 2011, the Foundation granted \$20.8 million to charitable causes, over \$2.1 million of which was through the Community Grants program.
